Fired EPA Scientist Gets His Job Back

A scientist fired from the Environmental Protection Agency after raising health concerns about fluoride has won a two-year battle to get his job back.

Labor Secretary Robert Reich ordered that William Marcus he returned to his \$87,000-a-year job and he paid back wages, legal costs

and a \$50,000 pennity.

The ruling upheld nu earlier decision by Administrative Law Judge David Clarke Jr., who concluded that Marcua actually was fired "because he publicly questioned and opposed EPA's fluoride policy."

EPA apokesman John Kasper said the agency would have no im-

mediate comment.
