COUNT ONE

[33 U.S.C. § 1908(a); 33 C.F.R. §§ 151.25(a), (d), and (h); 18 U.S.C. § 2(b)]

On or about March 18, 2006, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant DIAMLEMOS SHIPPING CORP., by and through its agents and employees, including officers in charge of, and the engine room crew of, the Motor Tanker ("M/T") Georgis Nikolos, whose actions were within the scope of their duties, did knowingly fail to maintain an

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1 Oil Record Book for the M/T Georgis Nikolos for the period  
2 between on or about January 18, 2006, and March 18, 2006, as  
3 required by law. Specifically, defendant, by and through its  
4 agents and employees, including officers in charge of, and the  
5 engine room crew of, the M/T Georgis Nikolos, whose actions were  
6 within the scope of their duties, maintained an Oil Record Book  
7 that contained entries that falsely stated oily bilge water was  
8 properly processed and disposed of through the Oil Water  
9 Separator, and omitted entries relating to the overboard  
10 discharges of such bilge water and oil sludge using a flexible  
11 hose that bypassed the Oil Water Separator between on or about  
12 January 18, 2006, and March 18, 2006.

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COUNT TWO

[33 U.S.C. § 1908(a); 33 C.F.R. §§ 151.25(a), (d), and (h); 18 U.S.C. § 2(b)]

On or about June 4, 2006, in Los Angeles County, within the Central District of California, defendant DIAMLE MOS SHIPPING CORP., by and through its agents and employees, including officers in charge of, and the engine room crew of, the M/T Georgis Nikolos, whose actions were within the scope of their duties, did knowingly fail to maintain an Oil Record Book for the M/T Georgis Nikolos for the period between on or about March 18, 2006, to June 4, 2006, as required by law. Specifically, defendant, by and through its agents and employees, including officers in charge of, and the engine room crew of, the M/T Georgis Nikolos, whose actions were within the scope of their duties, maintained an Oil Record Book that contained entries that falsely stated oily bilge water was properly processed and disposed of through the Oil Water Separator, and omitted entries

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1 relating to the overboard discharges of such bilge water and oil  
2 sludge using a flexible hose that bypassed the Oil Water  
3 Separator between on or about March 18, 2006, and June 4, 2006.
