GENERAL ALLEGATIONS

1. The *M/T Bow Lind*, a 26,327 gross ton ocean-going

petroleum/chemical tanker ship registered under the flag

administration of Singapore and bearing the International Maritime

Organization number 9388314, was owned and operated by the

defendant ODFJELL ASIA II PTE. LTD. The M/T Bow Lind was

engaged in international commercial maritime operations and

transported cargo to and from various ports around the world including New Haven, Connecticut.

2. The defendant ODFJELL ASIA II PTE. LTD. is a Singaporedomiciled company with offices at 27-08/9, DBS Tower Two, 6, Shenton Way, Singapore, 068809.

COUNT ONE

(Knowing Failure to Maintain Accurate Oil Record Book – 33 U.S.C. § 1908(a))

3. Paragraphs 1 and 2 are incorporated and re-alleged herein.

4. On or about November 6, 2012, within the navigable waters,

internal waters and ports of the United States in New Haven,

Connecticut, in the District of Connecticut, the defendant ODFJELL

ASIA II PTE. LTD. did knowingly fail to maintain an accurate Oil Record Book for the *M/T BOW LIND* in which all disposals and overboard

discharges of sludge, oil residue, and machinery space bilge water

were required to be fully recorded. Specifically, the defendant

maintained an Oil Record Book that: (1) falsely stated discharges had

been made through pollution prevention equipment; and (2) failed to

disclose overboard discharges of machinery space bilge water made

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with the use of equipment and procedures that bypassed the required

Oil Water Separator and oil monitoring equipment.

All in violation of Title 33, United States Code, Section 1908(a);

Title 18, United States Code, Section 2; and Title 33, Code of Federal

Regulations, Section 151.25.
