## Digest of Federal Resource Laws of Interest to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

## Fish and Wildlife Improvement Act of 1978

Fish and Wildlife Improvement Act of 1978 (16 U.S.C. 7421; 92 Stat. 3110) -- Public Law 95-616, approved November 8, 1978, authorizes the Secretaries of the Interior and Commerce to establish, conduct, and assist with national training programs for State fish and wildlife law enforcement personnel. It also authorized funding for research and development of new or improved methods to support fish and wildlife law enforcement.

The law provides authority to the Secretaries to enter into law enforcement cooperative agreements with State or other Federal agencies, and authorizes the disposal of abandoned or forfeited items under the fish, wildlife, and plant jurisdictions of these Secretaries.

It strengthens the law enforcement operational capability of the Service by authorizing the disbursement and use of funds to facilitate various types of investigative efforts.

Public Law 105-328, signed October 30, 1998, amended the Act to allow the Fish and Wildlife Service to use the proceeds from the disposal of abandoned items derived from fish, wildlife and plants to cover the costs of shipping, storing and disposing of those items. Expanded the use of fines, penalties and forfeiture funds received under ESA and Lacey Act to include the costs of shipping, storing and disposing of items. Specifically prohibits the selling of items whose sale is banned under other laws.
